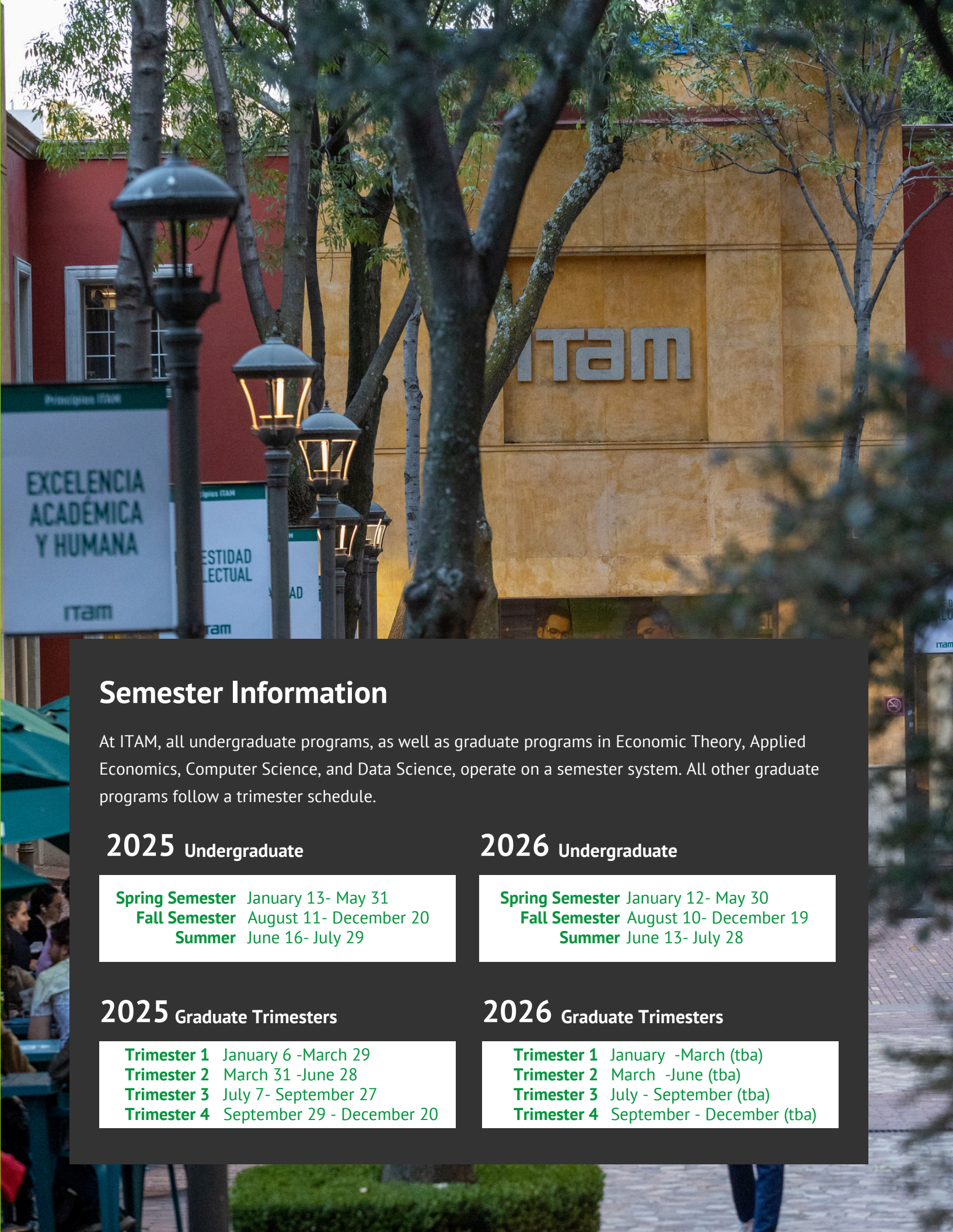

After being nominated, students will receive an email confirming their acceptance and providing instructions for registering through the online system.

To complete their registration, students must provide the following documents and fill in their personal information:

- Official Transcript of Records
- Curriculum Vitae (in English or Spanish)
- Copy of the main page of passport
- Copy of Medical Insurance Policy (must include a minimum coverage of USD \$50,000, a repatriation clause valid for Mexico). If not covered, ITAM insurance must be purchased before arriving in Mexico.
- A portrait picture (.jpg format)
- Proof of B2-level proficiency in Spanish (required to enroll in Spanish-taught classes). The nominator must confirm the applicant's Spanish proficiency or provide a valid certificate.

Please be aware that enrollment in master's courses requires the approval of the respective program director.

We process applications on a rolling basis. We encourage students to submit their applications immediately after being nominated by their home university.

Acceptance letters will be emailed to students. If necessary, packages containing the original acceptance letter and visa documentation will be sent directly to the nominating university once we have received complete applications from all candidates from that institution.

Note: Late applications may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Course Selection

Language of Instruction:

For courses taught in Spanish, we highly recommend that students have a B2 level of proficiency and possess strong reading, writing, and listening skills.

For those interested in courses taught in English, we offer 20 to 30 regular courses across all our programs each semester. Students whose primary language is not English are recommended to have a TOEFL score from 94 or above or an IELTS score of 7.0.

Spanish language courses for credit are available at different levels during most semesters. The levels offered depend on the number of registered students, but in general, we provide beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels. Spanish classes are free of charge for exchange students from partner institutions.

Additionally, language support is available through CARLE, ITAM's Center for Writing and Language, which provides:

- Specialized software for Spanish as a Second Language
- Spanish composition courses for native speakers
- Training in other languages

Enrollment

Full-time workload: To be considered full-time students, we require enrollment in a minimum of four subjects per semester (or trimester for graduate students).

Graduate trimesters:	33 hours of class equivalent to 4 ITAM credits
Undergraduate:	48 hours of class equivalent to 6 ITAM credits

Course Catalogue:

Nominated students will receive an access code to the course catalogue in their acceptance letters. Additionally, access codes can be provided to partner institutions upon request. Exchange students can register for courses through the university's online system one day before regular enrollment opens, providing priority access to secure their preferred classes.

Requirements/Restrictions:

- It is recommended that undergraduate candidates have completed at least 50% of their university studies.
- Graduate candidates must be pursuing their second higher education degree and must provide proof of completion of their first (undergraduate/bachelor's) degree.
- Nominees for the MBA program or any other graduate management course must have at least one year of relevant work experience.
- Students may enroll in any class across the institution at their level, provided they meet the equivalent prerequisites and have not previously taken the same or an equivalent course.
- Exchange students are not eligible to enroll in courses listed in the catalogue that begin with "EGN."
- Undergraduate students may not enroll in graduate programs. However, given that ITAM's undergraduate programs ("Licenciaturas") are rigorous, intensive 4–5 year programs, graduate students are allowed to take upper-level undergraduate courses.

Orientation

Attendance at the orientation session is mandatory. The session typically lasts a full day and is scheduled for the Friday before classes begin. Students should plan to arrive on time to fully participate.

Buddy Program

Students are encouraged to join this mentoring program, where they will be paired with a Mexican student who will help them transition into life at ITAM and in Mexico City.



Housing

ITAM does not own or operate student housing; however, the International Office assists students in finding off-campus housing options. There are many fully furnished student residences within walking distance of ITAM. Availability depends on the student's budget and preferred amenities. The International Office works closely with each student to identify suitable accommodations, but once a housing option is selected, the student is solely responsible for the lease.

Visa

ITAM will provide the letter of acceptance and the necessary documentation to obtain a student visa. However, exchange students should check with their nearest Mexican consulate for specific visa requirements.

IMPORTANT: Student visa holders must register and pay approximately US\$55.00 fee within 30 days upon arrival in Mexico.

STUDENTS FROM SOME COUNTRIES WHO APPLY FOR SHORT PROGRAMS (UNDER 180 DAYS) MAY ENTER THE COUNTRY ON A TOURIST VISA.

Insurance

Students must have an international medical insurance with coverage of at least \$50,000 USD and a repatriation clause valid in Mexico. If no proof of insurance is submitted, students will be charged for ITAM's insurance policy at a cost of around US \$250.00 per semester.
