GRADES

Grading System: H=High Pass; P=Pass; L=Low Pass, F=Fail Students who earn a Low Pass in more than 20% of their courses will be academically ineligible. Exchange students fall under the same policy as our Full-Time MBA students. Should a student receive an F, the home school will be notified and the student risks the loss of their visa.

Courseload & Credits

The MBA elective period (year 2) is divided into 4 modules (2 each in fall and spring). A student must enroll in a **minimum of 3 courses and 4.5 elective credits per module** to be considered full-time.

For the semester exchange, this equals 9 elective credits and 6 courses. A student cannot take 2 courses in one module and 4 in the other, as the minimum course load is 3. We recommend that students not take more than 5 courses per module. However, students can be approved to take 6 courses per module if they are **required** to do so by their home university.

Generally, a class consists of **20 in-class contact hours** and 30 out-ofclass (study groups, case readings, etc.) hours.

Transcript

A digital transcript will automatically be sent to the international office of the partner school that nominated their students. If the student has a stop/hold on their academic account, a transcript cannot be released.

Application Process

Nominated students will need to complete an application and submit a resume and headshot (photo).

Visa

In order to receive documents to apply for the J-1 exchange visitor visa, exchange students work with UNC Global's International Student and Scholar Services team (ISSS). Learn more at https://isss.unc.edu/newstudent/

Housing

There is limited availability for shared two-bedroom on-campus apartment housing, accommodated with basic furniture. These apartments are to be shared with another MBA exchange student of the same gender. Assignments are made on a first-come, first-served basis.



Campus Health

UNC Campus Health requires all students to have health insurance. Visiting exchange students can waive UNC's insurance if their insurance policy covers UNC's minimum requirements.

Health insurance policies for international students need to meet these minimum necessary requirements:

- A minimum medical benefit of \$100,000 coverage for each specific illness or injury.
- A deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness.
- Provide at least \$25,000 in benefits for repatriation of remains to the home country in case of death.
- Pay up to \$50,000 for medical evacuation to the home country.

<u>Immunizations</u> are **mandatory** for all students entering the University.

Students attending one module only are exempted from submitting immunization documents.

Exchange students have full access to campus health facilities and resources.

Onboarding

Orientation takes place at the beginning of each term. This is comprised of two days of mandatory sessions covering legal services, health insurance, academics, honor code, class attendance policy, and more.

Airport pick-up is available.

Students who wish to participate in the Buddy program will have a Full-Time MBA student assigned to partner with them.

Career Resources

During the exchange program, students have limited access to various career management services, including:

- Access to a Career & Leadership Coach (during office hours)
- Resume reviews and mock interview practice from the UNC Kenan-Flagler Business Communication Center
- Participation in student Career Clubs, managed by the MBA Student Association (MBASA)
- Access to company research databases

On-campus career fairs, as well as inclusion in UNC Kenan-Flagler's resume book, are not included.
